
SEA MONSTER DRAWS CROWDS AT ABERDEEN

Skeleton Being Preserved By Zoologists For Museum Display

ABERDEEN, June 8. — (AP) — Crowds gathered today at Copalis Beach to examine the remains of a 12-foot sea monster weighing 1,300 pounds. The monster resembled legendary sea serpents. It was found on the beach.

D. W. Black, Baltimore zoologist, and two assistants are at work on the body, scraping the flesh off. They will mount the skeleton for display either at the University of Washington in Seattle or in an eastern museum.

The monster has a long goat-like head. The body tapers like that of a Buffalo. The tail, four feet long, is similar to that of a muskrat. It has heavy, oily skin and 14 ribs. It may be a relative of *Amy Cadborosaurus*, Vancouver Island sea serpent seen several times during the past few years.
